Rehabilitation Treatment Therapy Modalities

Heated Underwater Treadmill

The therapeutic effects of water are combined with exercise to provide a safe and comfortable workout.

Electric Stimulation

Therapeutic Ultrasound Therapy

Cold Laser Therapy

All three above modalities are used to increase speed, quality and strength of tissue repair and to provide pain relief.

Balance Board, BOSU Board, Fitness Ball and Manual Therapy

Exercising on this equipment improves a dog's balance, core strength and proprioception (which is the sense of knowing where a body part is in space).

Stem Cell Therapy

Uses stem cells from the patients own fat tissue to treat traumatic and degenerative disease such as osteoarthritis.
